Requirements for Participation

All graduating high school seniors and current college students are welcome to participate.

However, in order to receive compensation, the following criteria must be met:

- United States citizen or permanent resident
- Minimum college GPA of 2.5 or high school GPA of 2.7

- Member of an underrepresented group in STEM, including Black or African-Americans, Alaskan Natives, American Indians, Hispanic Americans, Native Hawaiians, and Native Pacific Islander.
